Hiroshima and Nagasaki: Retelling the Story in Word and Music, and a Walk

Sunday, August 7, 3:45 PM, Unitarian Church of SI, 312 Fillmore St.

The story of the nuclear bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, sixty-six years ago, will be retold in word and music on Staten Island, on Sunday, August 7 at the Unitarian Church, 312 Fillmore Street, at 3:45 pm. The program, which is part of the Arthur Foise Summer Forum. will begin at 3:45 pm with music by pianist David Jones and singer Jeannine Otis. Father Liam O'Doherty, OSA, of Our Lady of Good Counsel, who worked in Nagasaki for a number of years, will introduce the story

of Nagasaki. It will be told along with the music of WaFoo, an ensemble of musicians who blend Japanese and jazz art forms.
All participants, led by Whitefeather, Native American drummers, will then be invited to walk in a solemn procession to the waterfront for communal song and reflections let by PASI Chair Eileen Bardel.

Near the end of World War II, on August 6 and 9, 1945, the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki were destroyed by 2 nuclear weapons dropped by the United States. Within 4 months, 166,000 were dead in Hiroshima and 80,000 in Nagasaki, killed by burns, debris, radiation sickness and other effects of the bombs.

Since 1945, no nuclear weapon has been used in a war, and to make sure that they never will be again, commemorations have taken place around the world to retell the story and recommit humanity to a world of peace without nuclear weapons.
